Principal, Khagarijan College, Nagaon, Assam and President of Asomiya Sahitry Sanmiloni has delivered the Keynote Speech of the seminar. The speaker has given imphasis on the importance os studying local history and folk culture of the region. The writing of local historyenriches the life and times of the community of a particular place by providing information related to historical sites and societies. It incorporate culture as social aspect of history of a locality. It should be kept in mind that national or regional history is always incomplete without local history. National history can never be built on a solid foundation without local history.

Dr. Surendra Kumar, Faculty of Social Sciences, Department of History, University of Delhi presented the speech of Guest of Honour and Resource Person. Dr. Kumar has highlighted the importance o local history and folk culture in world perspective as well as of Indian context. Emphasis was also given on the local history and culture of North East India and the state of Assam.

Technical Sessions (Day 1)

Academic Session I (11.00AM T0 1.30 PM)

After the end of the inaugural session the first Technical Session starts in tow rooms simultaneously in the college premises of Nanda Nath Saikia Colllege, Titabar from 11.00 am. In the first Academic session Dr. Surendra Kumar, Associate Professor, Department of History, University of Delhi was the Resource Person and this session started from 11.00 am to 1.30 pm at Room No. 26 of the college. Twenty five (25) researcher/academicians had presented their research papers in this academic session. The first paper was presented by Dr. Nibedita Paul, Professor, Dept. of Social Work, University of Science & Technology, Meghalay and the title of her paper was on "Socio-Economic Vicinity of Dimasa Tribe of South Assam". This paper critically examines initiatives for greater participation in socio-economic segment of tribal communities of India, arguing that current policy does not effectively enough to facilitate greater participation and may, in fact, go against the stated principle of ensuring greater equity. The paper relies on fieldwork-based study to support arguments for the need to be culturally sensitive in making appropriate provisions for the socioeconomic activity of scheduled tribes in India. The tribes of North Eastern Regions of India attracted the attention of sociologists, social anthropologists and administrators in order to understand the fabric of their socio-cultural life. But there are very few studies that reveal the process of modernization and development among the tribes of N. E. Region. In spite of primitive technology and poor economic condition the North East India is rich in spinning, dyeing and weaving which are primarily controlled by womenfolk. In Assam, the Cachari (Dimasa/Barman/Sonowal) are expert in rearing indigenous variety of cocoon, which is used for manufacturing of silk/cotton cloths. It is very clear that North Eastern Region has a very high potential for the development of textile

entrepreneurship as most of the tribal women already have weaving skill. The need is only to provide necessary technical and financial support and marketing facilities

Atrayee Kashyap, Research Scholar, Dept. of Cultural and Creative Studies North- Eastern Hill University, Shillong, Meghalaya has presented her paper on Exploring the Origin and the Folk Musical Tradition of the Deoris residing in Assam. The Deoris belong to the Sino-Tibetan family of Mongoloid stock. They are considered to be one of the communities found in Assam and some parts of Arunachal Pradesh in North- East India. The word *Deori* means the offspring of Gods and Goddesses. The Deori culture is facing danger from the clutches of globalization and striving hard to flourish. Such endangered culture so sprung -up by the nature thousand years past now deserve preservation and propagation by the government itself from being extinct. The paper is a humble endeavour to deal with the notions of authenticity, locality, vitality of oral culture and cultural identity of the Deori Community, in the realm of folklore.



Views of Technical Session

Bipasha Sarma and Banita Rongpi, Assistant professor, Department of Commerce, Narengi Anchalik College had presented their joint paper on Impact of Folklore, Traditional and Cultural Changes on Business. Bwhwithi Narzary, Research Scholar, Department of Commerce, Gauhati University has presented her paper on Livelihood Opportunities of the Bodo Community. Faculties from both universities and colleges, research scholars, academicians and some university students also presented research papers on various themes relating to the main theme of the seminar.

Academic Session II

The second Academic Session of the seminar started at room no. 24 of the college and Dr. Sagar Baruah, Rtd. Principal, Khagarijan College, Nagaon (Assam) was the Chairperson of the session. This session also started from 11.00 AM to 1.30PM and total number of paper presenter for the session was 25. Research papers relating to folk songs, oral traditions, tribal culture of Assam and North East India, history of indigenous tribal people, socio economic issues of the tribal people and historical aspects of the local people were presented in this second technical session.

The first presenter in this session was Dr. Bhuban Ch. Talukdar, Assistant Professor of English, Handique Girls' College, Guwahati and the title of his paper was on Folk Songs of the *Hajongs*: A Study. This research paper aims at discussing some folk songs of the *Hajongs* that reflect their culture, tradition and beliefs. Folk songs of this tribal community depict their folk beliefs regarding occupation, nature and supernatural agencies. Moreover, these songs are sung by this tribal community in order to celebrate their folk life and sustain their culture and tradition. These songs also reveal their ideas of integrity in terms of community life. The second presenter of the session was Dr. Jayanta Deka and the topic of the paper was on "Folk lives of The Bodos and their sociocultural aspects: A Descriptive Study". Some of the papers were presented by research scholars and some outgoing students of different university of the region. Anmona Goswami, a researcher from Tezpur University, Assam has presented her paper on 'Place of River Brahmaputra on Assamese Folk Literature'. Another scholar Manash Jyoti Nath of Gauhati University has presented his paper on 'The relation of Tiwa with the Ahom and Jaintia kingdom during the Medieval Period of Assam'. Similarly Syed Towhid Momin, a ex-student from the department of, Mass Communication and Journalism, Tezpur University has presented a paper on 'Scope and Challenges for Zikir and Zari to emerge as a mainstream Assamese Folk Media'.

Academic Session III

In the third academic session which was held in the Seminar Hall of the college Dr. Surendra Kumar, Associate Professor, Department of History, University of Delhi has chaired the session and the total number of paper presenters in this technical session III was 25. This session started from 1.30 pm to 4.00pm and academicians, researcher and faculties from different colleges has presented their research papers on different topics relation to the main theme of the seminar. After the presentation the discussion on the topic was held and suggestions, recommendations were given to the presenters to improve their papers. The findings of the papers were analyzed and questions were asked to the presenter on the topic. The first presenter in this technical session was Augustin Terang, Assistant Professor of the Department of Education , Morigaon College, Assam, Mr. Terang has presented his paper on 'Lalilang and it's social values' a folk song traditions of the Tiwas of Assam. The second presenter was Raktimjyoti Hazarika, Assistant Professor of the Department of History of Jorhat College, Assam. The title of his paper was on 'Jorhat During the Second World War: A Brief Local War History'. The third presenter was Mouchumi Borgohain of Dr. Nabin Bordoloi College, Titabar and her presentation was on 'Folk-Dances of Arunachal Pradesh: A Study'.

Technical Sessions (Day 2):

Academic Session IV

The fourth technical session was held on 25th February, 2021 at Room No. 26 in the Nanda Nath Saikia College premises from 9.30 am to 1.00 pm and Dr. Sagar Baruah, Rtd. Principal, Khagarijan College, Nagaon (Assam) was the Chairman of the session. Total number of paper presented in this session was 20 (Twenty) and research papers written both in English and Assamese language were presented by academicians and research scholars on different topics relating to the main theme of the seminar.

Academic Session V

The fifth technical session was held in the Seminar Hall of Nanda Nath Saikia College premises from 9.30 am to 1.00 pm and Mr. Budhin Dutta has chaired the session. Total number of paper presented in this session was 20 (Twenty) and research papers written mainly in Assamese language were presented by academicians and research scholars on different topics relating to the main theme of the seminar in this last session of the seminar. Most of the papers were on folk songs of indigenous people of Assam and local history of North East India.



At the time of release of the book entitled 'Exploring Local History and Folk Culture of North East India' Valedictory Session:







Thematic Rationale

Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose was one of the greatest freedom fighter of India who shook the British Empire completely and compelled them to leave our country. In the year 1938 and 1939 he was elected as the president of Indian National congress but due to the differences of opinion with Gandhiji and his followers he left the congress and formed Forward Block. Due to his active involvement in Freedom struggle he was placed under house arrest by the British. At the outset of the Second World War, he had travelled to a number of countries, including Soviet Union, Nazy Germany, and Japan to seek alliance to attack the British in India and expelled them out from the country. In 1942 Netaji went to Japan and there he had organize the POW to form an army for the cause of independence of India. He assured full co-operation by Hideki Tojo, the Prime Minister of Japan for India's freedom from British dominions and the Japanese had handed over the island of Andaman and Nicobar to Subash Chandra Bose in 1944.With his huge number of soldiers of the INA and support from like minded countries Netaji has given the slogan 'Delhi Cholo

When it comes to North-East India, the issue demands as well as deserves focal attention, since the significance of the roles played by this part of the land gets blurred when the National Leader is viewed from a global arena. North-East India has gone through the same turmoil of war waves as withessed by other parts of India. Contribution of North East part of India is equally significant when talked of India's War of Independence. The Indian National Army led by Subhash Chandra Bose, the Japanese troop, and the civilians of North East in connection to their respective vision and interest have gone through phases that history needs to recollect with more gone through phases that history needs to recollect with more vigour and specificity. In 1938, Netaji came to Assam as the president of AICC after getting invitation from Gopinath Bordoloi. The period was very critical for Assam.

Second World War broke out the When the nation leaders of India declared that all the Congress Ministries should resign from the Government. However, Netaji had the clear views that the Bordoloi's Government need not resign because of the unique vulnerability of Assam on the border of India. Subhash Chandra Bose and his coming to Naga Hills has many opinions which leave us on the verge of fact finding and research documentations that might reveal a new phase of knowing Bose through close quarters. North-East India and especially Nagaland has gone through the same turmoil of war waves as witnessed by other parts of India.

Many facts and records on Subash Chandra Bose is still Many facts and records on Subash Chandra Bose is suit not getting proper attention. A systematic study and research would necessary to highlight all the hidden aspects of Netaji's role in the freedom movement of India. The present seminar will try to highlight the role of Netaji in the Second World War and freedom movement of India with special reference to North Eastern region.










