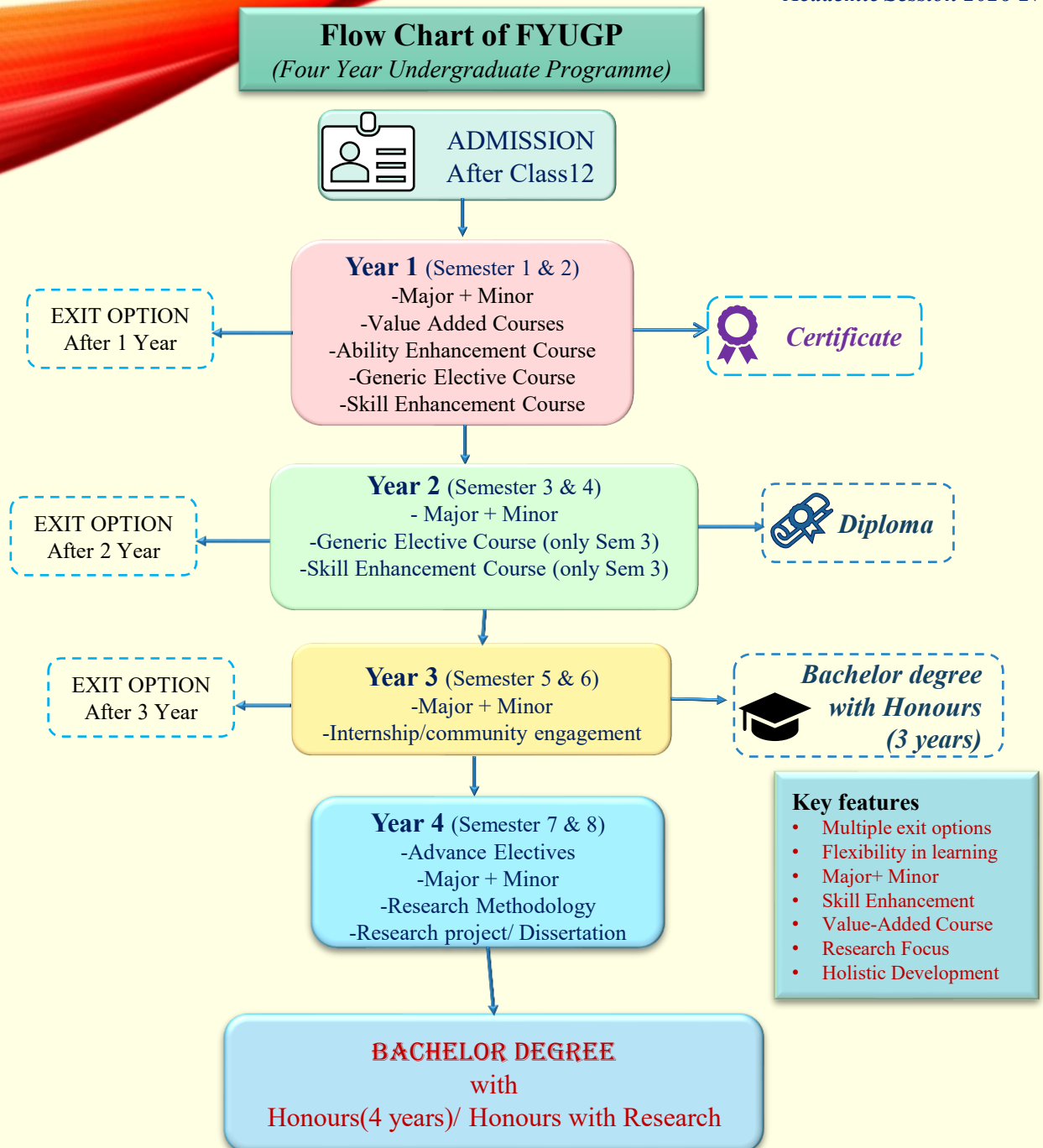

### Admission Instruction of ITEP (B.A. B.Ed /B.Sc. B.Ed):

1. Candidates must have secured at least 50% marks in Higher Secondary (10+2) or equivalent and qualified the **National Common Entrance Test (NCET)** conducted by the **National Testing Agency (NTA)**, as recommended by the National Education Policy 2020.
2. NCET is conducted online (CBT mode) in a multilingual format to assess subject proficiency and teaching aptitude.
3. Admission will be conducted through the **SAMARTH Portal** as per the guidelines of the National Council for Teacher Education.
4. Candidates must choose their subject/discipline (B.A. B.Ed. or B.Sc. B.Ed.) at the time of admission.
5. The merit list is published on both the Samarth Portal and the respective college website.
6. Selected candidates must report to the college on the notified date for document verification and final admission.

- Selection will be made strictly on the basis of **merit**

  3. All relevant supporting documents
- **Original documents** for verification

### GENERAL RULES OF THE COLLEGE

1. The academic courses offered in N.N. Saikia College are full time courses. So, no students can take any other full-time course concurrently.
2. Students should keep their bicycle/motorcycle etc. in the proper allotted permanent shed of the college.
3. No society can be formed in the college campus without any permission from the Authority. Without prior permission of the authority no person can be invited to a meeting in the college.
4. The college campus has been declared as tobacco free zone.
5. All students will be required to attend the classes and other activities in college uniform.
6. A student who fails to attend at least 70% of classes taught in a semester will be declared as dis-collegiate and will be debarred from appearing in the examination. Students having attendance within the range 70% to 80% will be treated as non- collegiate and are allowed to appear in the examination only on payment of Rs.700/- as fine.
7. Leave for participation in N.C.C. Camps, Debates, Quiz, Sports, and Cultural Programmes etc. are restricted as per college guidelines. The Principal must be given prior information in this regard.
8. Students applying for medical leave will have to submit a medical certificate issued by a Govt. Doctor along with the application within a week of joining the classes.

## COURSES OFFERED FOR B.A. (HONOURS) /B.Sc. (HONOURS) UNDER FYUGP IN CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS), 2023

*The Four-Year Undergraduate Programmes (FYUGP) in Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), 2023. These Regulations shall be effective for the Courses of Study leading to a UG Certificate, UG Diploma, Three Year UG Degree, Four Year UG Degree (Honours) and Four Year UG Degree (Honours with Research).*

### DEFINITION:

1. UG Certificate programme: UG Certificate Programme leads to a UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study. Students on exit shall be awarded UG certificate (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 40 Credits on completion of Semester II if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 2nd semester examination. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years and complete the degree within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.
2. UG Diploma Programme: UG Diploma Programme leads to a UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study. Students on exit shall be awarded UG Diploma (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 80 Credits on completion of Semester IV if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based 5 vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 4th semester examination. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years and complete the degree within the maximum period of seven years.
3. Three Year UG Degree Programme (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelors in other disciplines) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 3<sup>rd</sup> year (6 semesters) UG programme shall be awarded UG degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing a minimum of 120 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.
4. Four Year UG Programme with honours (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelors in other disciplines) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4<sup>th</sup> year (8 semesters) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years, securing a minimum of 160 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.
5. Four Year UG Programme with honours with Research (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelors in other disciplines) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4<sup>th</sup> year (8 semesters) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours and research degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of four years with a rigorous research project, securing a minimum of 176 credits. Provision of double Major shall be implemented in due course of time.
6. Programme: The term 'programme' is used to mean the whole learning experience or combination of courses pursued for a Certificate, Diploma or a Degree.
7. Course: A "Course" means one of the specified units which goes to comprise a programme of study.

## COURSES OFFERED FOR B.A. (HONOURS) /B.Sc. (HONOURS) UNDER FYUGP IN CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS), 2023

8. Academic Year: An 'Academic Year' means a period of twelve months consisting of two semesters.
9. Semester: The word "semester" is used to mean a half-yearly term or term of studies including examinations, vacations and semester breaks.
10. In-semester: The word "in-semester" is used to refer to the continuous evaluation within the half-yearly term.
11. End-semester: The word "end-semester" is used to refer to the terminal processes of examinations and evaluations at the end but within the half-yearly term.
12. Credit: A 'credit' is a unit by which the coursework is measured. It determines the number of hours of instruction required per week over the duration of a semester (minimum 15 weeks). A course may have only a lecture component or a lecture and tutorial component or a lecture and practicum component or a lecture, tutorial and practicum component, or only practicum component. Credit shall be defined as below:

**Academic Schedule:** The Academic Schedule of the UG Certificate, UG Diploma, Three Year UG Degree, Four Year UG Degree (Honours) and Four Year UG Degree (Honours with Research) Programmes shall be administered as per the Academic Calendar of the University published for every academic session.

**Minimum eligibility criteria for admission in Four Year Undergraduate programmes:** Senior Secondary School Leaving Certificate or Higher Secondary (Class 12) Certificate obtained after successful completion of Grade 12 or equivalent stage of education and/or Admission test conducted by College/University/National Level Testing Agency/State Level Testing Agency.

## COURSES OFFERED FOR B.A. (HONOURS) /B.Sc. (HONOURS) UNDER FYUGP IN CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS), 2023

### Minimum eligibility criteria for multiple entry points of the UG programmes:

- A. **1st year:** Senior Secondary School Leaving Certificate or Higher Secondary (Class 12) Certificate obtained after successful completion of Grade 12 or equivalent stage of education and/or Admission test conducted by College/University/National Level Testing Agency/State Level Testing Agency.
- B. **2nd year:** A certificate obtained after successful completion of 1 year (2 semesters) of the undergraduate programme. These students are to take admission in the 2nd year within a period of three years from obtaining the UG certificate from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution recognized by Dibrugarh University.
- C. **3rd year:** A diploma obtained after successful completion of 2 years (4 semesters) of the undergraduate programme. These students are to take admission in the 3rd year UG programme within a period of three years from obtaining the UG diploma from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution recognized by Dibrugarh University.
- D. **4th Year (Honours):** A Bachelor's degree after successful completion of three years (6 semesters) of the Undergraduate programme obtained from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution recognized by Dibrugarh University. These students are to complete the degree within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.
- E. **4th Year (Honours with Research):** A three-year Bachelor Degree with a **minimum of 7.5 CGPA**. The minimum entry requirement for 4th year (Honours/Research) UG programme within a period of three years from obtaining 3-year Bachelor Degree from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution recognized by Dibrugarh University. These students are to complete the degree within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

**Four Year UG Programme with Honours (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major:** Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours degree in the major discipline after successful completion of **four years with Discipline Specific Elective Courses semesters in lieu of Research Project and Dissertation securing a minimum of 160 credits.**

**Four Year UG Programme with Honours with Research (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major:** Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours with Research degree in the major discipline after successful completion of **four years, with Research Project and Dissertation securing 176 credits.**

(D) **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** These courses aim to enable the students to acquire and demonstrate the core linguistic skills, including critical reading and expository and academic writing skills and courses relating to Mathematical and Computational Thinking and Analysis.

**Computation of SGPA and CGPA:** The procedure to compute the SGPA and CGPA will be same as notified in the **FYUGP Regulations** of Dibrugarh University *(as approved by the 131<sup>st</sup> Special Meeting of the Academic Council, DU held on 13.06.2024)*

### ATTENDANCE

1. The Course Teacher shall be responsible for maintaining a record of attendance of students who have enrolled for the course.
2. All Course Teachers of college/institutions shall intimate the Principal/ Director of a college/ Institute through the Head of the Department concerned at least thirty calendar days before the last instruction day in the semester, the particulars of all students who have less than 80%of attendance during the total number of class days.  
In case of University Departments/Centre for Studies all course teachers shall intimate the Head of the Department/Chairperson of the Centre for Studies concerned at least thirty calendar days before the last instruction day in the semester, the particulars of all students who have less than 80% of attendance during the total number of class days.
3. A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination. However, that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons, on recommendation of the Head/Chairperson/ Principals of the Department/Centre/College on payment of a prescribed fee(s).
4. The Head of the Departments/Chairperson of the Centre for Studies/Principals of the Colleges shall announce the names of all students who shall not be eligible to take the End- semester examinations in the various Programs and send a copy of the same to the Controller of Examinations. Such candidates shall have to repeat the concerned Course(s) when it is offered next.
5. A student declared as dis-collegiate shall not be allowed to proceed to the next higher Semester. He/she shall need to pursue the Semester afresh in which he/she was declared as dis-collegiate along with the next fresh batch.

**EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION**

- (a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least two times during a Semester including the End Semester Examination.
- (b) There shall be 40% marks for in-semester assessment and 60% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.
- (c) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re- scrutiny.

**In-semester Assessment:**

1. In in-semester assessment, different tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses may be employed.
2. The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall be required to compulsorily attend in- semester assessment including appearing the sessional tests, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-semester examination. A Student cannot repeat In-semester examinations. The Department/Centre for Studies may arrange special in-semester examination whenever necessary.

**End Semester Examination:**

1. There shall be one End semester examination carrying 60 Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the Course. The End semester examination is normally a written/laboratory-based examination/Project Work/Dissertation.
2. The Controller of Examinations shall make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the End semester examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar notified by the University.
3. The time given for End-semester examination for each Course shall be based on the credits/marks of the course.
4. Emphasis needs to be given on problem solving, application-level questions as prescribed by National Education Policy, 2020. The question paper should include different forms of question.

**Betterment Examination:**

- I. A student shall be entitled to take the 'Betterment Examinations' in any two theory courses after successful completion of 3 year/4year programme only once. In this case, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidates shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the Sixth/Eight Semester examination. Students shall have to appear in the betterment examination with the regular batch.
- II. No betterments shall be allowed in the practical/project/dissertation/internship examinations.

**RESULTS AND PROGRESSION**

1. A candidate shall be declared as passed a Programme, provided he/she secures-
  - At least 30% of marks in each Course in the End Semester Examinations combining both theory and practical examinations
  - At least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale combining both the in- semester and End Semester Examination performance.
  - There shall be no separate pass mark for In-semester Assessment.
2. A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester/ programme, provided he/ she secures at least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale (given in clause) in all the Courses separately.
3. There may be moderation of In-semester Assessment marks/End Semester marks as and when necessary.
4. The marks of In-semester examinations obtained by the candidate shall be carried over for declaring any result.
5. A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more Courses of any end semester examinations up to fifth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carryover course in the next regular examinations of those courses. If a candidate fails in any of the components (either theory or practical) of a course the candidate shall have to reappear in the examination for both the components.
6. If a candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of the sixth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semesters.
7. A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of seventh semester examinations shall be provisionally promoted to the eighth semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). If a candidate clears 8 semester examination before clearing all the courses of the seventh semesters, the result of the eighth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semester.
8. A student must clear all his/her Semester Examinations within six (6) years for 3-year undergraduate programme and seven years for 4-year undergraduate programme (with honours/research) from the dates of admission to the First Semester of any Programme irrespective of the number of examinations appeared by the student.
9. Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.
10. A candidate shall be declared to have passed provided he/she has passed all the Semesters and in all the Courses separately for the concerned programme.
11. The Controller of Examinations shall declare the results of different programmes and issue Grade-sheets. The merit list shall be prepared only for the regular candidates and it does not include the backlog candidates.
12. The first rank holder of a programme shall be decided on the basis of the CGPA. However, the Overall Weighted Percentage of Marks (OWPM) of a candidate shall be considered in case of tie in CGPA.
13. Results of the candidates appeared in the Betterment or Backlog Examinations shall not be counted for the award of Prizes/Medals, Rank or Distinction.

### Provision of Multiple Exit

**Exit 1:** There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 1 year (two semesters). A Certificate will be awarded when a student exits at the end of year 1 (2 semesters). Students who have secured minimum of 44 credits will be awarded a UG certificate (in the field of study/discipline) if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 2nd semester examination.

**Exit 2:** There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 2 years (four semesters). A Diploma will be awarded when a student exits at the end of year 2 (4 semesters). Students who have secured minimum of 88 credits will be awarded a UG Diploma (in the field of study/discipline) if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 4th Semester examination.

**Exit 3:** Three Year UG Degree Programme (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 3 years (six semesters). Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme shall be awarded UG degree in the major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 132 credits.

**UG Programme with Honours(B.A., B.Sc., B.Com. and other disciplines)** Students completing the 4-year (8-semester) UG Programme with a minimum of 176 credits will be awarded an Honours Degree in the major discipline. In the 7th and 8th semesters, students will study Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses instead of a Research Project and Dissertation. The programme may be pursued with single or double major subjects.

**UG Programme with Honours with Research(B.A., B.Sc., B.Com. and other disciplines)** Students completing the 4-year (8-semester) UG Programme with a minimum of 176 credits and undertaking a Research Project and Dissertation in the 7th and 8th semesters will be awarded an Honours with Research Degree in the major discipline. The programme may be pursued with single or double major subjects.

### Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)

1. 'Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)' is an academic service mechanism as a digital/virtual/online entity established and managed by MOE/UGC to facilitate students to become its academic account holders and paving the way of seamless student mobility, between or within degree-granting Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) through a formal system of credit recognition, credit accumulation, credit transfers and credit redemption to promote distributed and flexible teaching learning.
2. Student Registration: Students shall register themselves by visiting the ABC website and creating a student account through the concerned institution and records has to be submitted to the institution.
3. Academic Flexibility: 'Academic Flexibility' is the provision for innovative and interchangeable curricular structures to enable creative combinations of Courses/Programmes in disciplines of study leading to Certificate/Diploma/Degree of study offering multiple entry and multiple exit facilities removing the rigid curricular boundaries and creating new possibilities of life-long learning.
4. Credit accumulation: 'Credit Accumulation' means the facility created by ABC in the Academic Bank Account opened by the students across the country in order to transfer and consolidate the 'credits' earned by them by undergoing 'courses' in any of the eligible HEIs. Credit recognition: 'Credit Recognition' means the credits earned through eligible/partnering HEIs and transferred directly to the ABC by the concerned HEIs.
5. Credit redemption: 'Credit redemption' means the process of commuting the accrued 'credits' in the Academic Bank Account of the students maintained in ABC for the purpose of fulfilling the 'credits requirements' for the award of Certificates/Diplomas/Degrees etc. by the degree awarding HEIs.
6. Credit transfer: 'Credit transfer' means the mechanism by which the eligible HEIs registered with ABC are able to receive or provide prescribed 'credits' to individual registered ABC account in adherence to the UGC credit norms for the 'course/s' registered by the desirous students in any HEIs within India. Inter- Institutional transfer of Credits may be considered by the Dibrugarh University on reciprocal basis or in compliance with the relevant Guidelines of the UGC. However, a candidate from other university has to fulfil minimum credit requirements as prescribed by Dibrugarh University.

## COURSES OFFERED FOR B. A. B. Ed. /B.Sc. B. Ed. UNDER ITEP PROGRAMME

*The Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) is a four-year dual-major undergraduate programme that combines Teacher Education with a specialized subject such as Language, History, Mathematics, Computer Science, Chemistry, Economics, Music, Art, or Physical Education. The programme provides holistic and multidisciplinary training by integrating modern pedagogy with foundational knowledge in Sociology, Psychology, Science, Early Childhood Care and Education, Foundational Literacy and Numeracy, and Indian knowledge systems, values, arts, and traditions. ITEP aims to develop passionate, professionally trained, and competent teachers who can design and deliver developmentally appropriate learning experiences for learners at different stages of school education.*

### DEFINITIONS OF THE IMPORTANT TERMS

1. **ITEP with Secondary Stage Specialization:** The name of the programme is Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) with Secondary Stage Specialization.
2. **Programme:** The term 'Programme' is used to mean the whole learning experience or combination of courses in the particular field of study.
3. **Course:** The ITEP is divided into a number of Courses. A Course may be considered as a paper in conventional education system.
4. **Academic Year:** An academic year means a period of twelve months consisting of **two semesters**.
5. **Semester:** The word "semester" is used to mean a half-yearly term or term of studies including examinations, vacations and semester breaks.
6. **In-semester:** The word "in-semester" is used to refer to the continuous evaluation within the half-yearly term.
7. **End-semester:** The word "end-semester" is used to refer to the terminal processes of examinations and evaluations at the end but within the half-yearly term.
8. **Internal Examiner:** The term 'Internal Examiner' refers to an examiner from the concerned institution appointed by the Head of the Institute from the panel of Examiners approved by the Dibrugarh University.
9. **External Examiner:** The term 'External Examiner' refers to an examiner from outside the concerned institute and appointed by the Controller of Examinations, Dibrugarh University from the panel approved by the University

### ITEP WITH SECONDARY STAGE SPECIALISATION

The Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) is of 4 years duration and is offered by the Dibrugarh University as per the NCTE 2023 Norms and standards. It is a Dual Major programme offered by the University. The Education content and domain-specific curriculum, i.e. the First Major contents, are incorporated from the NCTE Suggestive Curriculum Framework, and the domain-specific knowledge, i.e. 2nd Major and Minor courses, are incorporated as per the UG curriculum of Dibrugarh University.

## COURSES OFFERED FOR B. A. B. Ed. /B.Sc. B. Ed. UNDER ITEP PROGRAMME

### ATTRIBUTES OF GRADUATES IN ITEP

The attributes of Graduates of the ITEP include those that are specific to the chosen disciplinary/interdisciplinary Major/Minor as well as those related to other curricular components of ITEP such as Foundations of Education, Stage-Specific Content-Cum- Pedagogy, Ability Enhancement and Value-Added Courses, School Experience, including Internship in Teaching, relating to a Stage-Specific ITEP, and Community Engagement and Service, and attributes that are to be demonstrated by all student-teachers irrespective of their choice of Major/Minor areas of study and Stage specialization. Graduate attributes that are specific to the chosen disciplinary/interdisciplinary Major/Minor, as well as those related to other curricular components of the ITEP, include

- A comprehensive knowledge and coherent understanding of the chosen disciplinary/interdisciplinary Major and Minor, as well as of the Courses of study relating to other curricular components of ITEP and current and emerging developments associated with each of the Subjects/Courses of study.
- Procedural knowledge and capacities required for performing and accomplishing professional tasks associated with the chosen disciplinary/inter-disciplinary Major/Minor and Subjects/Courses relating to other curricular components of the ITEP.
- Capacity to apply the acquired knowledge and experience to generate solutions to specific problems associated with the chosen disciplinary/interdisciplinary Major/Minor and Subjects/Courses relating to other curricular components of ITEP, including real-life application of knowledge in multiple situations, and to solve problems relating to teaching-learning-assessment processes by selecting and using appropriate methods, tools, and materials.

*Attributes that are to be demonstrated by all student-teachers irrespective of their choice of major/minor areas of study and Stage specialization include:*

## **COURSES OFFERED FOR B. A. B. Ed. /B.Sc. B. Ed. UNDER ITEP PROGRAMME**

### **ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS AND RESERVATION POLICY**

A Certificate obtained after successfully completing Grade 12 (or equivalent stage of education such as Pre-University, Intermediate, etc.) with a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate or an equivalent grade from a recognized Board/University. The relaxation in percentage of marks in the Senior Secondary or plus two examinations or its equivalent examination and the reservation for Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Other Backward Class or Persons with Disabilities or Economically Weaker Section and any other categories shall be as per the rules of the Dibrugarh University.

### **ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

Admission to ITEP with Secondary Stage Specialization shall follow the NCTE guidelines. It will be done through a suitable subject and aptitude test (National Common Entrance Test (NCET)) conducted by the National Testing Agency (hereinafter referred to as 'NTA') and shall be standardised, keeping in view the linguistic and cultural diversity of the country. Its score would reflect the relative performance level of the candidate for merit-based selection to secure admission.

### **APPROACH TO CURRICULUM TRANSACTION**

The approach to the transaction of the ITEP curriculum will focus on enabling student teachers to attain the defined competencies and learning outcomes relating to Courses associated with each of the curriculum components that would enable student teachers to achieve the expected Graduate Attributes. The curriculum transaction will involve learner-centric pedagogies and pedagogical practices that would help facilitate well-structured and sequenced acquisition of knowledge and capacities. A practicum linking Theory with Practice will constitute an important aspect of the teaching-learning process. The teaching process will include Lectures supported by Tutorial work; Practicum and field-based learning; the use of teaching-learning material, including e-learning resources and other self-study materials; project work, some of which may be team-based; activities designed to promote the development of generic/transferable and subject-specific knowledge and capacities; exposure to different types of schools and other teacher education institutions and/or research facilities, school-based internship, etc.

### **MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION**

The curriculum shall be transacted in English and/or Assamese. However, the question papers shall be designed in English only. The students shall have to answer either in English or Assamese.

### **ATTENDANCE**

- 1. Theory Courses:** A student-teacher who has less than 85% attendance in the Theory Courses shall not be permitted to sit for the End-Semester examination in the Course in which the shortfall exists, Provided that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a teacher-student (who has attended a minimum of 75% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 85% attendance for valid reasons), on the recommendation of the Principal/Head of the Department on payment of a prescribed fee(s).
- 2. Practicum:** 85% attendance is compulsory for the Practicum courses other than the Internship.
- 3. Internship:** The minimum attendance percentage for the Internship is 90%.

## COURSES OFFERED FOR B. A. B. Ed. /B.Sc. B. Ed. UNDER ITEP PROGRAMME

### NETWORK OF SCHOOLS FOR PRACTICE

All institutions offering the ITEP shall partner with a network of schools to ensure a strong theory-practice connection in the programme.

### SEMESTER SYSTEM

The ITEP with Secondary Stage Specialization will be organised according to the semester pattern of two semesters in an academic year. Each semester will consist of 15 -16 weeks of teaching-learning activities, excluding end-semester examinations. A semester will comprise at least 96 working days, excluding end-semester examination days. Each working week will have at least 40 hours of instructional/contact time.

### DURATION

The duration of the ITEP Programme shall be four years spread over 8 (eight) semesters, as follows:

- Semester(s) I, III, V & VII (Odd Semesters): 1st July – 31st December
- Semester(s) II, IV, VI & VIII (Even Semesters): 1st January – 30th June

These students are to take admission in the 2nd Year within a period of three years from obtaining the ITEP Certificate from Dibrugarh University or any other University/ Institution recognised by Dibrugarh University.
3 <sup>rd</sup> Year	Diploma obtained after successful completion of 2 years (4 Semesters) of the ITEP Programme. These students are to take admission in the 3rd year ITEP Programme within a period of 3 years obtaining the ITEP Diploma from Dibrugarh University or any other University/ Institution recognised by Dibrugarh University.
4 <sup>th</sup> Year	A Bachelors' Degree after successful completion of 3 years (6 Semesters) of the ITEP Programme obtained from Dibrugarh University or any other University / Institution recognised by Dibrugarh University. These students are to complete the Degree within the stipulated maximum period of 7 years.

### NOMENCLATURE OF DEGREE AWARDED

*As the ITEP is a Dual Major programme with School Stage specialisation, it will lead to the award of one of the following Degrees, depending on the chosen discipline of study and Stage-specific specialisation. As this regulation deals with ITEP with Secondary stage Specialization, the nomenclature of the degree will be:*

**B. A. B. Ed.:** ITEP with Secondary Stage Specialization and 2<sup>nd</sup> Major in any of the following subjects: Assamese, English, Economics, Geography, History, Political Science.

**B. Sc. B. Ed.:** ITEP with Secondary Stage Specialization and 2<sup>nd</sup> Major in any of the following subjects: Botany, Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics, Zoology.

## COURSES OFFERED FOR B. A. B. Ed. /B.Sc. B. Ed. UNDER ITEP PROGRAMME

### ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION

1. Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least two times during a Semester including the End Semester Examination.
2. There shall be 40% marks for in-semester assessment and 60% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.
3. There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.
4. ***In in-semester assessment:***
  - In in-semester assessment, different tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses may be employed.
  - The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall be required to compulsorily attend in-semester assessment including appearing the sessional tests, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-semester examination. A Student cannot repeat In-semester examinations after the end of the Semester. The Department may arrange special in-semester examination whenever necessary.
5. ***End Semester Examination:***
  - There shall be one End semester examination carrying 60% Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the Course. The End semester examination is normally a written/laboratory-based examination/Project Work/Dissertation.
  - The Controller of Examinations shall make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the End semester examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar notified by the University.
  - The time given for End-semester examination for each Course shall be based on the credits/marks of the course. The duration of End semester Examination shall be of 2 (two hours) for 3 /4 credit courses and 1 (one hour) for 2 credit courses.
  - Emphasis needs to be given on problem solving, application level questions as prescribed by National Education Policy, 2020. The question paper should include different forms of question.
6. ***Confidential Works:*** Setting of question papers, moderation of question papers, evaluation of answer scripts, scrutiny, tabulation of marks, etc. and announcement of results, shall be governed by the Dibrugarh University Ordinance.
7. The mode of the conduct of the end-semester examinations of the practical/dissertation courses shall be partially external as below:
  - The end-semester examinations of all practical/dissertation courses shall be conducted by a Board of Examiners consisting of the internal examiner (the concerned course teacher) and an external examiner appointed by the Controller of Examinations.
  - A student shall not be allowed to take more than one full course as project work in a single semester.
8. The mode of end-semester examination and evaluation of the Course shall be specified in the detailed syllabus of the course concerned.
9. End-semester practical examinations shall normally be held before the theory examinations.
10. ***Betterment Examination:***
  - A student shall be entitled to take the 'Betterment Examinations' in any two of the theory courses of a single semester after successful completion of 3 year/4 year only once. In this case, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidates shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the Sixth/Eight Semester examination. Students shall have to appear in the betterment examination with the regular batch.
  - No betterments shall be allowed in the practical/ project/ dissertation/ internship examinations.

## COURSES OFFERED FOR B. A. B. Ed. /B.Sc. B. Ed. UNDER ITEP PROGRAMME

### RESULTS AND PROGRESSION

1. A candidate shall be declared as passed a Programme, provided he/she secures-
  - I. At least 30% of marks in each course in the End Semester Examinations combining both theory and practical examinations
  - II. At least 40% of marks or 'P' grade in the 10 point scale combining both the In-semester and End Semester Examination performance.
  - III. There shall be no separate pass mark for In-semester Assessment.
2. A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester/ programme, provided he/ she secures at least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale (given in clause) in all the Courses separately.
3. There may be moderation of In-semester Assessment marks/End Semester marks as and when necessary. The scaling procedure will be applied only if there are more than 70% of the students of a college who's In semester marks deviate more than 20% and will be applied college-wise. No scaling procedure will be applied for the End semester absentee candidates.
4. The marks of In-semester examinations obtained by the candidate shall be carried over for declaring any result.
5. A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more Courses of any **end semester examinations** up to fifth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed Course as carry over Course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carry over course in the next regular examinations of those courses. If a candidate fails in any of the components (either theory or practical) of a Course the candidate shall have to re-appear in the examination for both the components.
6. If a candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the Courses of the previous semesters, the result of the sixth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the Courses of the previous semesters.
7. A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of seventh semester examinations shall be provisionally promoted to the eighth semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). If a candidate clears the 8 semesters examination before clearing all the courses of the seventh semesters, the result of the eighth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semester.
8. A student must clear all his/her Semester Examinations within six (6) years for three-year undergraduate programme and seven years for 4-year undergraduate programme (with Honours/research) from the dates of admission to the First Semester of any Programme irrespective of the number of examinations appeared by the student.
9. A candidate shall be declared to have passed provided he/she has passed all the Semesters and in all the Courses separately for the concerned programme.
10. The Controller of Examinations shall declare the results of different programmes and issue Grade-sheets. ***The merit list shall be prepared only for the regular candidates and it does not include the backlog candidates.***
11. The **first rank holder of a programme shall be decided on the basis of the CGPA.** However, the Overall Weighted Percentage of Marks (OWPM) of a candidate shall be considered in case of tie in CGPA.
12. Results of the candidates appeared in the Betterment or Backlog Examinations shall not be counted for the award of Prizes/Medals, Rank or Distinction .

### ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDIT

#### **Institution Registration**

1. The HEIs shall register on NAD/ABC in the concerned portal. Institution shall designate a Nodal Officer and set up a dedicated NAD/ABC cell for implementation of NAD/ABC Scheme and reflect their details (Name, Designation, Mobile No. and email id) on its website.
2. Institution shall advise the students to register on ABC through the ABC portal
3. Institution shall make ABC id a mandatory field in the admission forms, Examination forms or if possible, on students Identity card also.
4. Institution shall display the posters and templates and place them on the canteen, Library, Notice Board and around the playground or the place where there is maximum movements of students
5. Institution shall organize Seminar/Workshop for information and publicity about ABC in campus as well as respective affiliated colleges.

**Credit Transfer:** Inter- Institutional transfer of Credits may be considered by the Dibrugarh University on reciprocal basis or in compliance with the relevant Guidelines of the UGC. However, a candidate from other university has to fulfill minimum credit requirements as prescribed by Dibrugarh University.

#### **General:**

1. It shall be ensured that the University shall maintain fundamental code of professional ethics in implementing these Regulations.
2. For any matter not covered under these Regulations, the existing Dibrugarh University Rules, Ordinances and the Dibrugarh University Act, 1965 (as amended) shall be applicable.
3. The Examination Committee of the University shall remove any difficulty, which may arise in the course of operations relating to execution.
4. **The 4 year Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) shall follow the 3+1 year pattern with 6 semesters of the FYUGP in the first 3 years and the final 2 semesters in 1 year**

## UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS 2009:

1. In exercise of the powers confirmed by clause (g) of sub-section (I) of section 26 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956, the UGC hereby makes the following Regulations:
2. Every public declaration of intent by any institution, in any electronic audio visual, print or any other media, for admission of students to any course of study shall expressly provide that ragging is totally prohibited in the institution and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging, whether actively or passively or being a part of a conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished in accordance with these regulations as well as under the provisions of any penal law for the time being in force.
3. The application form for admission, enrolment or registration shall contain an undertaking mandatorily in English or in one of the regional languages known to the applicant in Annexure -I to these Regulations to be filled up and signed by the applicant and the parents/guardian in Annexure-II.
4. The institution shall constitute an Anti-ragging committee to take appropriate decision in regards to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of its incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendation of the Anti- Ragging squad.
5. The Anti-Ragging Committee may impose the following punishments depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established.
6. (i) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges. (ii) Withholding/Withdrawing scholarship and other benefits. (iii) Debarring from appearing in any Examinations. (iv) Withholding results. (v) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, Youth festival etc. (vi) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel. (vii) Cancellation of admission. (viii) Rustication from the institution. (ix) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
